



Say Please!

Do you sometimes feel like your dog is running the show? Or maybe your dog is just a bit too demanding, rude or refuses to listen? If so, *Say Please!* may help. This program can help improve a dog's behavior and teach him to respect you as his or her caregiver in a non-confrontational way. By requiring your dog to 'work' for what he/she wants, you establish clear rules and expectations for your relationship.

- 1. Using positive reinforcement, train your dog to do some basic behaviors, for example: sit, down, stay, shake, speak, go around, touch, roll, wave, look, etc.
- 2. Ask your dog to preform one of the behaviors he/she knows before getting something they want

Dog + Behavior = Reward

A Reward is Anything your Dog Wants

(a walk, dinner, access to the outside, a treat, to play with other dogs, etc)

For example:

- If your dog wants to go for a walk, ask him to sit before putting his leash on
- If it's time to eat, have your dog touch your hand before setting his bowl down
- If you are going to allow your dog to run off leash, have him sit while you take off his leash then go around in a circle before you release him
- If your dog is in the car, make him sit and stay while you open the door then give you a paw before you allow him out

Keys to Success...

- Ignore all behavior you don't want, especially demanding or pushy behaviors
- Say the cue (command) only once. If your dog doesn't respond, walk or turn away and try again a few seconds later
- Be patient, especially in the beginning as your dog works to figure out what is being asked of him/her (it's so much easier to learn when the teacher isn't annoyed with us!)
- It is best if the entire family follows the Say Please! program dogs relish in consistency
